Now you will be able to

- \* Print exactly the pages you want when you need them. Just be sure to specify which pages you want to print in the print dialog box or the entire set will print by default. Example: To print page 5 enter: "Print page 5 to 5"
- \* Combine graphics in this set with all of our other sets.
- \* For the largest size prints, in the print dialog box, change the default setting of Layout from "fit to page" to "100%". You can print any smaller size you need by changing to a smaller size %.
- \* Use your printer's "high quality" setting for the best results. It can make a lot of difference.
- \* Use heavy weight paper for best results, like index, cover or card stock.
- \* Use this paper for backgrounds and to mat photos & page titles.
- \* Use parchment or colored paper for an antique look.
- \* Make your own scrapbook supplies for just pennies per sheet. To save money on inkjet cartridges, refill your own. You can now buy refill kits at office supply stores but you can save a bunch more by buying kits from independent suppliers like Mister Ink Jet. They can be reached at [www.MisterInkJet.com](http://www.MisterInkJet.com) The generic cartridges they sell are very good and in my experience, take more refill than the brand name ones. Just be sure to refill BEFORE you run out of ink completely. Also, if you put cellophane tape on the bottom of your cartridges during the filling part, be sure to remove it before replacing in the printer.
